Examination guidelines

1. Shall have one regular examination followed by supplementary examination in a year.
2. If a candidate fail they can be promoted to next year
3. A candidate can take any number of attempts with a condition that maximum period allowed is 6 years. However all previous papers need to be cleared before appearing in the inal examination
4. No institution shall submit student average internal marks more than 75% i.e., if 40 students are admitted in a course than the average score of the 40 students shall not exceed 75%.
Example of 5 students: A=25, B=20, C=22, D=21, E=24
Average score=89.6%
This will not be accepted by the State Nursing Registration Council
5. Minimum pass marks should be 50% in each of the Theory and practical paper separately.
6. Minimum pass marks shall be 40% for English only.
7. Theory and Practical exams for Introduction to Computer to be conducted as School exam and marks to be send to the SNRC/ Board for inclusion in the mark sheet.
8. A candidate has to pass in theory and practical exam separately in each of the paper.
9. If a candidate fails in either theory or practical paper he/she has to re-appear for both the papers (Theory and Practical)
10. Maximum number of candidates for practical examination should not exceed 20 per days.
11. All practical examination must be held in the respective clinical areas.
12. One internal and one external examiners should jointly conduct practical examination for each students.

Important Note:

- i) The application received after the closing date will not be accepted. The School/institute will take no responsibility for any delay in the receipt or loss of application.
- ii) Incomplete application in any case will be rejected.

Counselling:

1. List of eligible candidates for counseling will be displayed according to their merit on the Notice Board of the School.
2. Number of candidates called for counseling will be twice the number of seats in each category.
3. Candidates have to appear for counseling on specified dates and report at **GGCET ST XAVIER'S INTERNATIONAL SCHOOL OF NURSING**, Dhanbad, Jharkhand.

Admission:

1. Selected candidates must join on the specified date that will be notified after Medical examination by the Board constituted by the authorities and also must deposit fees and required documents in specified time period.
2. Candidates who fail to join on the specified date shall automatically stand cancelled candidature of his/hers and their seats will be declared vacant/allocated to next meritorious candidate, as the situation may allow.
3. In case of non-availability of candidate against reserve seats (SC/ST/OBC, Dependents of Defense/Para-Military Personnel) the seats may be filled by UR candidates.

Eligibility for Admit Card issuance for Term/Annual Examination of State Nursing Council Examination Board.

1. She/he has completed not less than eleven months of the course.
2. A candidate must have a minimum of 80% attendance (irrespective of the kind of absence) in theory classes of each subject for appearing in Examination.
3. A candidate must secure 50% marks in internal assessment separately in each theory and practical.
4. A candidate must have 100% attendance in each practical to be eligible to receive completion certificate/diploma by the State Nursing Council Examination Board.
5. The practical record must be complete, signed by the tutor and countersigned by the Principal before filling up Council Examination Forms. It is the responsibility of the candidate to make sure that his/her practical records are signed.
6. A certificate of completion of internship will be provided to each student by the Principal before appearing for the examination.
7. The diploma shall not be awarded to the student till he/she has completed the clinical/field requirements.
8. Practical examination for GNM will be conducted quarterly (3 months) by the school itself to assess clinical skills, ward management and other professional trends. Marks obtained from these exams will be submitted to the Council which will be added in the overall result.
9. Certificate by the Council/Board will be issued only after successful completion of the Internship period.

Placements

We have efficient & consistent Training and Placement Cell. The Placement Coordination Cell is a facilitation for the students of the school and prospective employers to find their respective targets. Medica Superspecialty Hospital, Narayana Health Multispecialty Hospital, along with our parent hospital SJAS SUPER SPECIALTY HOSPITAL are our prime recruiters. Our students are placed across different branches of Medica and Narayana. Apart from that students are also working at Government Hospitals of Jharkhand, Bihar & Bengal.

Centers of Excellence

1. Lecture hall:

There are 3 spacious Lecture Halls, and 1 fully equipped Conference hall with seating capacity of 100 people. The lecture halls are well lighted, well ventilated, aesthetically designed and furnished with adequate seating facilities for the students. The Conference Hall is equipped with modern Audio-Visual gadgets like- white board, over head projector, slide projector, LCD projector etc. which facilitate efficient and effective teaching learning sessions.

2. Laboratories: -

There are seven laboratories which are efficient to carry out procedures and where the students learn under the expert guidance of respective subject teacher.

These laboratories are -

- Anatomy Laboratory
- Pre-clinical Sciences Laboratory
- Fundamental of Nursing Laboratory
- Community Health Nursing Laboratory
- Skill Laboratory
- Nutrition Laboratory
- Computer Laboratory

3. Library

- There is a well stocked library consisting of professional books, journals, and magazine, etc.
- Rupees 500/-will be charged one time as a refundable security in addition to the specified fees.

4. Hostel

- Separate Accommodation may be provided for both boys and girls for GNM courses subject to request and availability . All students must abide by the rules and regulations of hostel, failing of which disciplinary action will be initiated.
- Students will pay the Hostel Charges (rent/electricity/water etc) as applicable from time to time in addition to the specified course fees..
- Silence must be maintained in the rooms and campus.
- All the students must sleep on their own allotted bed to be provided by the Institution.
- Fans and lights must be switched off while not in use.
- No visitors/guardian should enter the room of their wards.
- Authorities may step in the rooms with the hostel supervisor as and when required.
- Sanitary pads should be discarded in the dustbins.
- Audio must not be played if objected by the rooms in mates.
- The Management is at liberty to add/change/amend any rules, time to time, for smooth functioning of the school and boarding houses of which all the students shall abide by. Ragging in any form is strictly prohibited.

5. Mess - For Boarders only

- None is allowed to cook in the rooms.
- The students will enjoy 3 course meals at the school run mess at scheduled charges. A separate canteen is also available in campus for various miscellaneous food/stationary etc. items.
- All meals will be served in the mess only.
- Students are to enter the mess in proper dress. Open hair are not allowed.
- Wastage of meals is strictly prohibited. Quantity of each serving must be consumable.
- Qualitative degradation in meals should be reported to the Hostel Supervisor.

RULES/REGULATIONS TO BE FOLLOWED IN THE SCHOOL OF NURSING AND HOSTEL

- Relatives and parents are not allowed inside the hostel else fine up to Rs. 5000/- can imposed.
- No electrical appliances viz iron heater etc are allowed in the hostel.
- Student are not allowed to leave the hostel without the prior permission of the Principal or Hostel Warden.
- Entry in the out pass register is mandatory while going for night pass and outing. It must be noted that such leaves shall be allowed ONLY with Parents. No relatives like Grandfather/Uncle/Brothers etc. shall be entertained for such leaves.
- Attendance is compulsory and should be marked between 7:00 pm to 08:00pm.
- Students are not allowed to enter the hostel during Clinical and college hours except during Tea Break i.e. 11:30 to 12 noon. Any student found inside the hostel between the prohibited period without the prior permission of Principal or Warden will be strictly fined for Rs. 100/- per instance for maximum of 3 instances in a term. After that Names will be struck off from the register.
- Maintain cleanliness of your room, bathroom and cubicles.
- Cooking is not allowed in the rooms.
- Nobody is allowed to roam in bathroom sleepers or night suits in the school campus/Mess.
- Students should only sleep in their allotted room.
- Indecent or rude behaviour with the mess workers, Seniors/Juniors and other staff strictly prohibited.
- Proper clothes should be worn and hair be properly tied while coming to mess.
- In case of any emergency or health related problems, hostel in charge should be informed.
- Ragging is strictly prohibited in the campus.
- No leave/outing will be given to pursue other academic courses during the course period.
- No leave other than the Medical leave will be allowed. Medical leave will be granted only if prescribed by the SMO/MO.
- If any student found absent from the hostel without any information, strict disciplinary action will be taken against her with a fine up to Rs. 5000/-. If absence period is more than 5 days, fine will be imposed up to Rs. 5000/- and student will be debarred from exams/expelled from training.
- In case of any indiscipline, the student will be expelled from the training/School.
- Students should strictly abide by the rules and regulations of the Institute, Hostel an Mess framed herein and time to time.

SAY **NO** TO RAGGING



Anti Ragging

Ragging in any form is banned inside and outside the campus of GGCET School of Nursing. Strict action will be taken against persons flouting this rule; no leniency will be shown. Suspension and/or withdrawal from the hostel/ institute will be the first action against the offender. The Supreme Court of India has also defined ragging as a criminal offense.

Any conduct by a student, whether by words spoken or written or by an act which includes physical abuse, lewd acts, teasing, rough or rude treatment, indulging in rowdy, undisciplined and obscene activities which causes or is likely to cause annoyance, undue hardship, physical or psychological harm or mental trauma or raise apprehension or fear in a fresher / junior student or other students or forcing a student to do any act which such a student is not willing to do and which has the effect of causing or generating a sense of shame or embarrassment or danger to a student's life or adversely affect the physique or psyche of a fresher or a junior student.



Nursing Foundation Lab

This lab is well-equipped with 10 beds & set of all items needed for nursing procedure practice to provide comprehensive nursing care to the clients admitted in the hospitals, students will be given preliminary training in patient care at the college laboratory.





CHN & Nutrition Lab

This lab ensures that the students learn home visiting bag technique & practice the community health nursing while providing family health care at the door step of the clients using modified home visiting kits.





Advance Nursing Skill Lab

The aim of this Lab is to provide best practical knowledge in advance nursing procedures under the guidance of experts in subjects.





OBG and Paediatrics Lab

This Laboratory is for Midwifery Experience. Lab is equipped to develop skills handling normal and complicated delivery. The students gain skill in imparting primary maternity and paediatric care. Our institute provides Excellent Laboratory Facilities for basic learning with maternal and Child Health Science. The Lab comprises of latest equipments as prescribed by the WBNC.





Pre-clinical Science Lab

It is well-equipped with models & specimens, all the bones, skeleton & subject related charts etc. The students are encouraged to use our Anatomy lab to learn Anatomy of bone & joints & other systems.

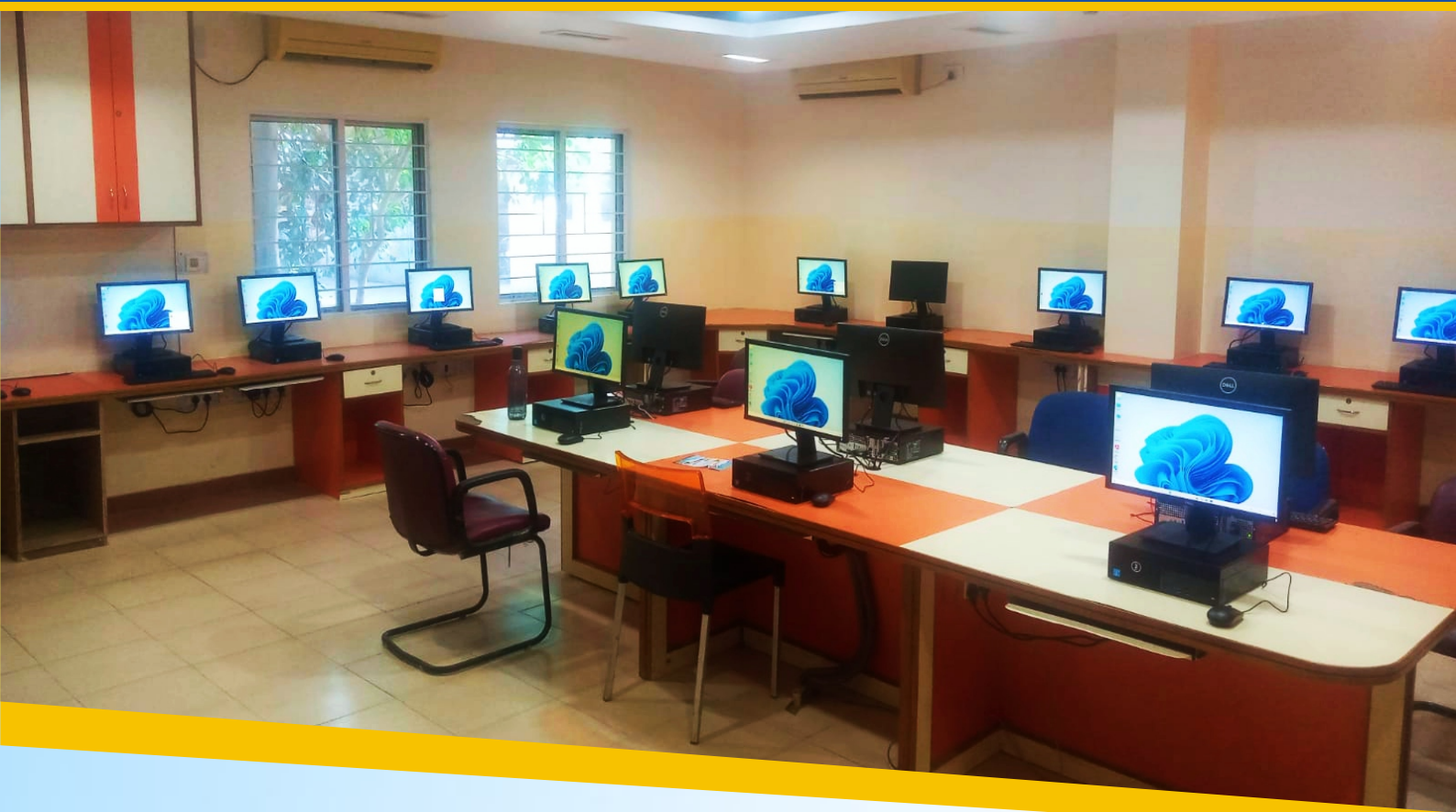




Audio-Visual Aids Room

Our AV-Aids Rooms are fully equipped with various electronic devices for the effective teaching & learning such as LCD projectors, over head projectors, T.V, V.C.R, C.D. Player, Tape recorder etc. We also have various teaching materials & demo materials, which helps in teaching and practical classes.





Computer Lab

We have a well furnished and well ventilated computer lab. There are thirty computers in our lab. There is a separate cabin for staffs and students. There are sufficient chairs available. Internet facility is also available in our computer lab.





Library

The Library in GGCET Nursing is having adequate number of books for students and lectures referral. Also we have plenty of journals for students' reference, which help them to enhance their knowledge in various areas of health care profession. Our library is managed by a qualified full time available librarian to guide students in various aspects.

E-Library

In our institute we have emphasis on E-Library facility so that students of our institute can go beyond the available books to enhance their knowledge.



Students will gain experience in various clinical specialities such as:

- General medicine where students can interact with real patients in ward and study ICU cases.
- General surgery which includes pre-operative and post-operative cases.
- Obstetrics and Gynaecology where students may see caesarean section deliveries.
- Orthopaedics that includes general cases, emergency cases, Polytrauma cases.
- Ophthalmology and Otorhinolaryngology (ENT) cases both of which include pre-operative, post-operative and out-patient cases.
- Paraclinical specialities, such as Pathology, Microbiology, and Biochemistry with a fully functioning diagnostic laboratory.
- Superspecialities such as Cardiology, Nephrology, Oncology, Plastic Surgery, Pulmonology among others.

In addition to this we have arranged community visits to various reputed hospitals in urban and rural areas for our students.
